PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

It has been great to hear about all of positives that came out of Education Week this year. Thank you to our team of educators, and our Education Week team who provided a wide range of activities focused on the Education Week theme 'I learn, We Learn'. I have been impressed with the work that the students were able to complete and this was highlighted by the videos completed by each team which showcased the Education Week theme. I know our students really enjoyed having a number of parents attend on the Thursday, visiting the classes and participating in our activities. Thank you to everyone who was able to take time out of their busy schedules to attend.

Out teacher mentoring program has begun this term. This program is focused on supporting our teachers to develop their skills to enhance the already high quality of programs that already occur at George Bass School. Over the coming weeks our teachers will be observing the lessons of others, participating in team teaching sessions and developing resources to support new programs. This will have a minimal impact on most classes and should support innovation in programs for all of our students.

New Personalised Learning Plans (PLPs) have been developed for the upcoming semester. Parents and families may have noted a change in the structure to these this term, with a renewed focus on individual planning in the delivery of goals in numeracy, literacy and PDHPE. Goals in other Key Learning Areas will be a part of regular class programs in the future and will be continued to be delivered with the same level of planning as in the past, with accommodations and adjustments being made in each lesson.

Currently our school is clarifying the process for what is required in order for therapy support to work with the school. If you require contact between a therapist and your child then an application needs to be made firstly through the school and secondly in the form of a clearance with the Department of Education. If you wish for a therapist to enter a class to provide some level of support to your child an application will need to be made via Toula or myself so that this can be raised with our learning support team. We are currently in the process of finalising the request process for this. In the interim if you have any questions about this don't hesitate to ring the school for clarification. In the upcoming week further information about this process will be made available by the school. We appreciate your patience in us navigating this new process in the interim.



This term our class has started a directed drawing program, we follow a video tutorial on how to draw animals related to our areas in interest or area of learning. Directed drawing allows us to follow step by step instructions through watching and listening to create our own pictures. It also helps us with fine motor skills and spatial awareness within an A4 page. We have created a wall in the classroom to display all of our hard work and will put all our images together at the end of the year to create a portfolio.

KULA CLASS

What a fantastic start to term 3 for Kula class! Students have been enjoying our hands-on activities and settling back into our new routines and class programmes.

We have been starting our day with morning circle and Kula students have been enjoying locating the colour-coded tabs in their morning circle booklets.

In English, we have been reading the storybook of The Three Little Pigs, and re-enacting the story using props such as drinking straws (house of straw), popsicle sticks (house of sticks) and wooden blocks with shaving foam (house of bricks) before answering reading comprehension questions. Our favourite prop, is a picture of the wolf attached to a hairdryer. In Mathematics we are learning about fractions and how to share food items (cookies, fruit) equally. In the afternoon, we love taking part in some roleplaying at Kula class café (see picture below) using PECS visuals to order food. Our favourites are red apples, banana, and class made popcorn.

BIDJAWONG CLASS

Bidjawong Class have had an exciting start to Term 3! We have welcomed Thomas to our Class and begun a variety of programs across all Key Learning Areas.

In Accelerated Literacy we are studying the text Caps for Sale by Esphyr Slobdokina which we are all really enjoying. We are studying livability in urban and rural settings in geography, chemical reactions through experiments in science and interpersonal relationships in PDHPE. We are going to be creating 2D and 3D artworks using a range of materials as well as learning a variety of songs and dances in creative arts.

All students in Bidjawong class have been working hard to develop their communication skills, particularly making requests for items and activities in the classroom. Ben, Ramona and Thomas are all working hard to use visual schedules when completing set tasks and activities in the classroom.

Sensory integration is a core part of our program in Bidjawong Class. Ben and Ramona really enjoy using the bodysock. Thomas loves to use the trampoline and shaving cream to write his name on the desk. Some of our other favourite activities are using the sensory tent and coloured lights, listening to music, using water and catching bubbles with a special glove.

All students in Bidjawong class are currently learning about ways to stay safe at home, school and in the community as well as ways to care about ourselves and others through the PBL values of 'We are Safe' and 'We Care'. We are very proud of all the students in Bidjawong Class!
