This was an informative session which helped form a picture of how our parents can support their children moving into post-school life. Transition sessions occur each year to support our year 11 and 12 students and families prepare for post school life.

Huge thanks to the large number of staff who came down on the day to support the event, our students and our school. KUNG GUNG CLASS


The students of Kung Gung class have settled back into school after the holidays and have been learning lots of fun things as we explore our latest programs for Term 2.
