Term 2 has been a very busy one for Bidjawong class and it's just the way we like it! We look forward to what next term has to offer.

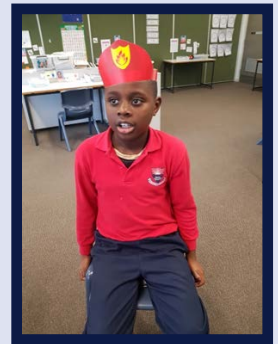


## BUNDELUK CLASS
